- [Concert in Ouagadougou](#) on 21 July 2006 to support the 7th annual meeting of the African Movement for Children and Young Workers (MAEJTS), attracting crowds of 15 000 people.
- [Seminar on the launch of the project](#) and [training on Children's Rights](#), led by MAEJTS (African Movement for Children and Young Workers), [training on artistic rights and copyrights](#), led by Accents Multiples. Publicity through mention in a magazine for a national TV channel. [National press conference dedicated to Children's Rights](#).
- [Free concert in Niamey](#) (Niger) in August 2006 which focused on Children's Rights and attracted over 10 000 young people.
- In September 2006 all the members of AURA took part in the [filming of a television documentary](#) in Burkina. The documentary formed part of Plan Holland's "[Stop the Violence](#)" campaign.
- Pheno B, who represents Niger in the AURA group, travelled to Holland where he performed concerts, participating in a [campaign supporting disadvantaged children](#).
- AURA took part in the 6th annual [Ouaga Hip Hop Awards](#) in October 2006, drawing their biggest crowds yet.
- In October and November 2006, they [recorded the album POTO-POTO](#) in Ouagadougou and [organised an international press conference](#).
